ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES – TUESDAY, March 21, 2023

PRESENT: Susan Hunting, Mary and Jeff Krejci, Janice Schlotman, Jody Weaver, Bev Arvin, Gene Groetken, Deb Sitzmann, Kirk Scheelhaase, Lisa Fouts, Pastor Sheryl Ashley, District Superintendent Michel Lundula

Pastor Sheryl opened the meeting with prayer.

REV. DR. MICHEL LUNDULA – expressed his gratitude to all of us for serving on the Ad Council and in other roles in our church. He has been searching for a new pastor for us and feels that God is working with us on this search. Dr. Lundula is hopeful that he will have found a new pastor for us by July 1, 2023. He feels that the best option for us may be to share a pastor with another local church. He recommended keeping the tenants in our parsonage now as that income is very beneficial to us. If the issue of needing a parsonage for a new pastor should become important in the future we will discuss it at that time. He stated that the Conference has resources to move someone forward in the process if there is someone who feels called to serve as a minister, lay preacher, or any other role in the United Methodist Church. He urged us to stay in touch with him as we move forward.

Lisa Fouts wanted to know if the disaffiliation voting that took place in December 2022 was a straw poll and what it means going forward. As noted in both the ballot title and introductory notes of the ballot, the vote was a straw poll to gauge the interest of the members of Moville United Methodist Church in disaffiliating from the United Methodist denomination. With 71% of those voting indicating a desire to remain affiliated with the United Methodist Church, the council will not pursue disaffiliation.

Minutes from the February 9, 2023, meeting were reviewed and no corrections were noted. Motion to accept by Janice, 2nd by Bev; minutes approved.

FINANCIAL REPORT

We have received very substantial gifts from Doc and Helen Maxwell. The Youth account received \$45,000, bringing that account total to \$70,000. We are extremely grateful to them for this donation and are in the process of coming up with meaningful ideas on how some of the money can be spent.

We are in receipt of \$510 as proceeds from the Souper Bowl meal earlier this year. We will apply this toward the MidAmerican Energy bill for the parsonage to help out our tenants. The tenants have paid rent for December, 2022. and January, 2023; they are still owing for February 2023.

Motion by Janice to accept the financial report, 2nd by Bev; motion passed.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Pastor Sheryl thanked all the members of the congregation for filling in for her while she has been out ill with bronchitis.

OLD BUSINESS

The Lenten Breakfast on March 8th in our church was a big success with 40 people attending. Thank you to all who put that together and prepared, served, and cleaned up.

NEW BUSINESS

We would like to have a Love Offering to help out the Kim and Larry Hamman family. We have learned of their financial hardship due to medical issues. Anyone wishing to donate may do so during church service. Motion by Bev, 2nd by Jody: motion passed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

FINANCE – Committee will be meeting this Sunday, March 26, after service.

EDUCATION – We have one more Sunday of this session of Adult Sunday School.

MISSIONS – Balance in Guatemalan student account is \$769.57.

SPPR – Still trying to find a custodian for the church. During the interim, Doug Seitzinger has volunteered to clean

TRUSTEES – Working on getting the automatic doors installed for the handicap-accessible entrance as well as the main church entrance. Randy has worked up the plans and will be meeting with a contractor. Next, the group will be looking at what needs to be done this spring.



It does not seem like it now, but summer IS coming and that means Church Camp. Registration is open for the 2023 camping season at lake Okoboji UM Camp. Last year over 400 kids attended an event or week at camp. Some events/weeks fill up quickly, so now is the time to check the camp web site for the list of camp opportunities offered this year.

Things to know:

The offering for UMCOR Earthquake Disaster Relief in Turkey was \$246.

The offerings for the Moville Ministerial Transient Ministry from two Lenten Breakfasts totals \$387.

The deadline for Iowa UM congregations wanting to disaffiliate from the denomination is approaching. Those wanting to exit must have held their Special Church Conference in order to be considered for disaffiliation at the Special Annual Conference held in November 2023. To date, 71 lowa congregations have met the criteria. This is almost 10 percent of lowa congregations.



Midwest Mission News

MM has responded to the devastating earthquake in Turkey. When a disaster strikes, MM does not automatically begin sending items. MM waits for a call from a partner organization in the area. This is because MM never wants to cause more chaos in the affected area, and never assumes what is needed in a particular disaster.

The first shipment of disaster relief left MM on March 10 and contained 24,027 MREs valued at \$40,846. This is part of a \$500,000 donation of Ready to Eat meals (MREs), a totally self-contained complete meal designed for military use.

Later shipments of aid to Turkey will contain Personal Dignity Kits (PKDs), perhaps from lowa and maybe from Moville.
