ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES – Thursday, February 13, 2025

PRESENT: Susan Hunting, Mary and Jeff Krejci, Kirk Scheelhaase, Gene Groetken, John and Janice Schlotman, Stee Maxwell, Robin Beck, Daryl and Barb Carr, Harold Werley, Randy Petersen

Susan opened the meeting with prayer.

DAYCARE PROJECT- Stee updated the group regarding the anticipated daycare project for our church. It was recommended the flat roof project be delayed until the fall so it can be included in the daycare project. Rasmussen Mechanical will be at our church February 19th to perform an analysis of our current boiler. Tad Maxwell has spoken to Mullin Awning and Siding in regard to obtaining an estimate to replace the remaining windows in our church. Mullin is about 4 months out in their work load. Tad offered his own estimate of approximately \$65,000 for window replacement. Tad will work on getting asbestos testing done on the floor tiles in the classroom wing.

Jeff brought to the attention of the group that there was an error in the latest blueprint that had been supplied by the architect. An interior wall in the hallway was positioned incorrectly. Robin will bring that to the attention of Brian Crichton (CMBA architect.)

Regarding funding - Robin envisions "community fund raising" for the daycare project. Our church should focus our fundraising on the \$20,000 balance for our portion of the flat roof and also sharing in the cost of new windows.

Stee said MCDAI is identifying what needs to be done by June. Grants are awarded in August. The project cannot begin until the grant is approved.

MINUTES Motion by Janice to accept minutes from last month's meeting, 2nd by Kirk; motion passed. PARSONAGE-Harold has been in touch with the Sioux City housing authority in regard to rent assistance for Sara McCormick in our parsonage. He reported that as soon as an inspection of the premises is done, Sara should be approved for \$1250 per month for October, November, and December, 2024; and for 6 months moving forward at \$1156 per month. He will let Sara know that we are requesting she make a good faith payment of at least \$800 by March 1st, 2025, toward the 3-4 months that she will still owe after the emergency grant payments. The remainder of the past due will be paid over the next several months. Motion by Janice to accept this agreement, 2nd

TREASURE'S REPORT- January weekly giving was above budget, making it 4 months in a row that weekly giving has exceeded budget. We have upgraded our version of Quickbooks. This is the first upgrade in 14 years. Monthly reports may look a little different due to the change in software.

We have completed raising the \$4000 for our balance of the sanctuary roof. Now we must concentrate on the \$20,000 for the flat portion.

Jeff has transferred the \$50,000 flat roof donation from Tad and Stee Maxwell from the general account to the building account.

There was no OLD BUSINESS

by Gene; motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS Ash Wednesday service will be held on March 5th and ashes will be distributed there. Susan will find out from Pastor what time the service will be held. We will invite the members of Grace Church in Correctionville to our church for the service and for refreshments in our fellowship hall following the service.

Lenten breakfasts are as follows: March 12th at the Catholic Church; March 19th at our church; March 26th at the Lutheran Church. Each breakfast will start at 7:30 a.m.

COMMITTEE REPORTS FINANCE - Bev will be stepping back from serving as the Mission coordinator. We hope to finish

up supporting our current student and then re-evaluate the program.

We should look at ideas for fundraising for the flat roof.

MEMBERSHIP SUPPORT AND EDUCATION - We have plans to have special celebrations for both Mother's Day and Father's Day this year.

UNITED WOMEN IN FAITH – Met 2-12-25 for lunch. Their goal continues to be to provide more fellowship and support for each other and the congregation.

Our next Administrative Council Meeting will be Thursday, March 13, 2025, 6:00 p.m. All are invited to attend.

Rofait Ibrahim farms on the Nigerian island of Dadi Louis where the salty water makes it hard to grow crops. Yet despite the challenges she is determined to provide for her family. Thanks to Heifer's support she is successfully growing tomatoes (which are a staple in Nigerian dishes). The sale of her tomatoes allows her family money and a better life.

Heifer provided tomato seeds and training to Rofait and other farmers to increase their production. There are plans to dig a new deeper well on the island to reach water with a lower salt content.
