

Spring is here, and new life is all around us. The story of the Resurrection of Jesus is the cornerstone of the church. The Apostle Paul says that without the Resurrection, our faith is in vain. Easter is a time to reflect on what God has given us. It is a tremendous opportunity to respond to God's greatest gift, his Son, Jesus Christ, who died on the cross for our sake- yours and mine- for the forgiveness of sins and the gift of everlasting life. ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES – Thursday, March 13, 2025

PRESENT: Susan Hunting, Mary and Jeff Krejci, Kirk Scheelhaase, Gene Groetken, Janice Schlotman, Stee Maxwell, Pastor Eric Sayonkon, Diane Weaver

Susan opened the meeting with prayer.

DAYCARE PROJECT- Stee updated the group regarding the anticipated daycare project for our church. We have received a preliminary report on the tile sample that was taken. It measured within the legal limit for asbestos. More samples from piping and ceiling tiles have also been taken. The report on those should be back within the next week. Tad Maxwell has received an estimate of \$40,000 to replace the classroom wing windows. Brian Crichton took measurements earlier this week. The area at the top of the stairs leading to the classroom wing measured, which is adequate for a security door to be installed there and to separate the daycare wing from the rest of the church.

Missouri River Historical Development grant applications are due at the end of June, 2025.

MINUTES- Motion by Janice to accept minutes from last month's meeting, 2nd by Diane; motion passed. TREASURER'S REPORT- Rent assistance of \$7218 for our tenant at the parsonage has been received. This amount represents \$1250 for each month of October, November, and December, 2024 - along with \$1156 per month for January, February, and March, 2025. We should still receive \$1156 for the next three months of 2025. Our tenant still owes \$2620 in back rent that is not covered by the \$7,218. Harold has sent a letter to her asking for that full amount by the end of June, 2025. The letter states she must pay that amount if she wishes to continue living in that house.

We sent out five \$250 second semester checks for the college students who qualified for the MaxwellFamily Educational Scholarship.

PASTOR'S REPORT- Pastor met with Kirk and Vern Knaack from Correctionville in regard to his duties. He felt it was a good conversation. He has paid a visit to some members of our church who are no longer able to get out and attend church service. Those families report that they do feel the support of our church. He plans to continue reaching out to the homebound. He has met with the Bishop. Planning for Annual Conference is going on. Pastor's mother is still hospitalized in Omaha. Pastor would appreciate prayers for his family. Pastor would like to meet with the entire congregation to hear about our hopes and dreams and our feel for how we are doing as a congregation. Also, he would like to discuss stewardship in our church and finding ways to help each other and our community. He would like to have this conversation at a gathering on Sunday, April 6th, at 4:30 p.m. in our fellowship hall. We will make it a potluck for all to participate and enjoy.

OLD BUSINESS- The snow policy for church events was reviewed. In consultation with a member of the Ad Council, Pastor will make the decision if church service or a particular event will be held. He will communicate if there is a need to cancel. A team of Cassie Colyer, Mary and Jeff Krejci will make sure to get the notification out via KTIV, our church website, and Facebook. Motion by Jeff to accept this proposal, 2nd by Gene; motion passed. Church members should check one of those methods of communication to confirm if the event or service will be cancelled. It is to be assumed that the event will happen unless there is a notice of cancellation. NEW BUSINESS- We discussed having a confirmation class for eligible young people in our congregation. We also would like to get a list of names of adults who are interested in becoming members of our church. He will have Cassie put an announcement about this in the bulletin. Cassie's office hours have been changed from Tuesday, March 25th to Thursday, March 27th, due to school hours changing.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

FINANCE - Gene thanked Harold for all his work in obtaining the rental assistance for our parsonage. It has been a long, drawn-out affair.

MEMBERSHIP SUPPORT AND EDUCATION - George Allen suggested conducting a short prayer service for Craig Sitzmann outside Craig and Deb's house on Wednesday, March 13th. It was very much appreciated by the family. Gene suggested it would be a nice thing to send cards to Craig and Deb from time to time to boost their spirits.

Her school year is from February to November and we provide tuition assistance plus funds for her to participate in the Lifting Up My Student program which provides online courses with private tutors to help with

subjects at school. Your gifts make a difference in Leslie's life. Leslie's scholarship is totally funded by your donations (no money comes from the church budget). Leslie's scholarship for 2025 is \$1490.00. We have paid the first half and second is due June 1st. We need about \$300.00 to full fill this commitment. A container remains on the table at the back of the sanctuary for your donation. Your help is really appreciated for the 2025 school year.

Heifer Highlights

Rofait Ibrahim farms on the Nigerian island of Dadi Louis where the salty water makes it hard to grow crops. Yet despite the challenges she is determined to provide for her family. Thanks to Heifer's support she is successfully growing tomatoes (which are a staple in Nigerian dishes). The sale of her tomatoes allows her family money and a better life.

Heifer provided tomato seeds and training to Rofait and other farmers to increase their production. There are plans to dig a new deep-

er well on the island to reach water with a lower salt content. Rosie the cow welcomes your gifts. Please continue to "feed" Rosie the cow located on the table at the back of the sanctuary.
