

ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES – Thursday, April 10, 2025

Susan opened the meeting with prayer.

DAYCARE PROJECT

Stee, Jody and Jeff were joined by Daryl Carr, Randy Petersen, and Larry Etler for an online meeting Wednesday, April 9, 2025, with a representative from MidAmerican Energy in regard to our plans. This audit of energy is being done at no cost to the church. Dave Brockshus has been assigned by CMBA as the architect for this project. Angel House Preschool in Sioux City has closed recently and we will be receiving some of their furniture for our daycare. We plan to store it until our facility is ready. The project team is currently working through options for providing heating, cooling and fresh air for the daycare rooms.

Missouri River Historical Development grant applications are due at the end of June, 2025.

MINUTES

Minutes from the March 13th meeting were reviewed. Motion by Kirk to accept the minutes, 2nd by Diane; motion passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Income from March was again approximately \$2000 below budget; we received \$5425, budgeted amount is \$7620.

We should still be receiving \$1156 per month for April, May, and June, 2025 for the balance of our tenant's rent assistance. The tenant is still responsible for the remaining unpaid rent balance.

During the month of March, we paid \$2124 quarterly liability insurance for the church property and \$1792 in property taxes for the parsonage.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Pastor Eric has been preparing for Annual Conference. He has met with the bishop regarding the French Ministry congregation of Sioux City, which is largely made up of immigrants from French-speaking African nations. Recently, the ministry has been meeting at Wesley Global Methodist Church in Sioux City and they would like to find a more permanent location in which to hold their services.

He continues to visit with members of our church who are no longer able to get out and attend church service. Those families report that they do feel the support of our church. He plans to continue reaching out to the homebound.

Pastor would like to thank all who prepared food and met for the recent potluck. He thought it was very productive and it gave him a chance to meet with us and to hear any concerns we might have.

There will be a Maundy Thursday service at Correctionville Grace UMC at 6:30 p.m. on April 17th. All are invited to attend.

NEW BUSINESS

Susan will order copies of songbook The Faith We Sing for Liz, Rochelle, and Cassie.

Woodbury Central will send over a group of students on Friday, April 11th, to assist in cleaning up the church grounds.

Graduating seniors this year are Keaton Gernhart and Logan Jensen. We will honor them at our Mothers' Day service on May 11, 2025.

Living Heritage Foundation Scholarship Program

We provide a scholarship for Leslie Jimenez a student in Western Guatemala. She is in grade 11. Her school year is from February to November and we provide tuition assistance plus funds for her to participate in the Lifting Up My Student program which provides online courses with private tutors to help with subjects at school. Your gifts make a difference in Leslie's life. Leslie's scholarship is totally funded by your donations (no money comes from the church budget). Leslie's scholarship for 2025 is \$1490.00. We have paid the first half and second is due June 1st. We need about \$300.00 to full fill this commitment. A container remains on the table at the back of the sanctuary for your donation. Your help is really appreciated for the 2025 school year.

Midwest Mission- "Sending hope and empowerment around the world and around the corner"

In September of 2024 hurricane Helene brought unprecedented flooding to western North Carolina as almost 14 inches of rain fell over three days causing rivers to flood washing roads, homes and businesses away.

In October 2024 five shpments of supplies were shipped but disaster relief was still needed. In March 2025 another shipment was sent, containing among other things, 280 Personal Dignity Kits. I dreamt of dolls with pretty hair And dresses, oh, so sweet. Bats, Balls, and baseball gloves, Lay 'round my feet.


I dreamt of things galore

We love her!


Mother's Day

One of our modern writers, William Ross Wallace (1865) wrote:

The Mothers Day act was passed by both branches of our national Congress and approved by resident Woodrow Wilson on May 8, 1914. The Bill Authorized the President to issue a proclamation calling upon all government officials to display the American flag on all government buildings on the second Sunday in May. Furthermore, the President was empowered to designate this second Sunday in May as Mother's Day and to request its observance.
