My hope is that we will demonstrate radical hospitality in reaching others in our community by sharing God's love and live with "open hearts, minds and open doors"



ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES - Thursday, August 14, 2025

PRESENT: Susan Hunting, Mary and Jeff Krejci, Jody and Diane Weaver, Harold Werley, Randy Petersen, Daryl Carr, Pastor Eric Sayonkon, Janice Schlotman, Tom Utesch, Gene Groetken Pastor Eric opened the meeting with prayer.

MINUTES

Minutes from the July 10th meeting were reviewed. Motion by Janice to accept the minutes, 2nd by Gene; motion passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT

We received a large donation just after the first of July which helped considerably to bring our actual giving more into line with budgeted. Y-T-D expenses match very closely with Y-T-D income.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Pastor has been dealing with grief in his personal life. He will preach this Sunday and then plans to leave early next week to travel to Liberia for his sister's funeral. The funeral is scheduled for Saturday, August 23rd. He will be gone approximately 12-14 days. He asks for our prayers as he travels and conducts the funeral in Africa.

Harold will preside over a baptism that is scheduled in our church for August 31st.

OLD BUSINESS

DAYCARE UPDATE - MCDAI has proposed an additional section to our classroom lease with them outlining the Right of First Refusal; in the event that at some time in the future our church should no longer exist and the Conference decides to sell the building. Motion by Jeff to accept this modification to the existing lease which was approved June 20th, 2nd by Janice; motion passed. Jeff will forward the proposal to the District Superintendent for review by the Conference.

MCDAI plans to make a formal announcement on August 21st as to the award amount for this project.

PARSONAGE - We have rented out the parsonage for over five years with an average annual rent of nearly \$11,000. Average annual expenses including property taxes, insurance, and maintenance, have been approximately \$7000, leaving a net annual income after expenses of approximately \$4000.

We have received insurance payments of \$339,000 and a verbal offer of around \$50,000 for the sale of the parsonage. The resulting \$389,000 invested at 4% would provide a net annual income of \$15,500, significantly more than the net annual income of \$4000 provided by

keeping, repairing, and renting the parsonage.

The county assessor has set a market value for the parsonage at \$270,000. Market analysis on the Zillow website places the parsonage market value at \$290,000, based on the actual sale of similar homes in Moville, IA. These estimated market values indicate a real opportunity to accept and invest the insurance money and salvage money of nearly \$390,000 and invest it for steady interest income.

It was noted that, although not currently the case, there is the possibility, depending on pastor assignments and church partnerships, that a shared housing allowance would be part of the pastor salary package. This would come out of the investment interest income.

It was also made clear that the insurance and salvage amount to be invested can only be used for church capital projects as needed. Only the interest can be used for operating expenses, just like the rent was being used for operating expenses. The steps to sell the parsonage, as outlined by the DS, were reviewed with the Ad Council. As was voted on at the August 10, 2025, meeting of the Board of Trustees, the Trustees recommended to the Ad Council to start the process to sell the parsonage.

A motion was made by Jody to sell the parsonage, 2nd by Jeff; motion passed.

Informational meetings will be held with the congregation in preparation for a future church conference regarding the parsonage.

WATCHFIRE DIGITAL SIGN - We will get back to them with our thoughts and ask them for pricing ideas on signs for the front lawn of our church.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

FINANCE/MISSIONS - Finance committee met to review scholarship applications for the 2025/26 academic year. They approved six students to receive \$500 each for the academic year. The scholarships are sent to the educational institution in the amount of \$250 per semester. Gene will review the students; records at the end of fall semester to ensure they remain eligible before the second semester checks are mailed.

Balance in the Guatemalan student account is \$16.82.

MEMBER SUPPORT/EDUCATION - Sunday School will begin September 28th. There will be three separate classrooms; Diane will teach P-2, Danielle Jensen will teach grades 3-6, and Becky Dahna will teach the older children. THANK YOU, ladies, for covering this very important part of our church mission.

SPRC - Pastor reported that they are preparing for charge conference. Pastor would like to continue building faith and fellowship. We will be planning another potluck meal this fall. More details to come as plans are made.

On July 4, 2025, historic rain levels led to catastrophic flash flooding along the Guadalupe River in Central Texas. UMCOR has awarded a solidarity grant to the Rio Texas Annual Conference to support their relief efforts. This grant will provide immediate relief to those impacted through Early Response Team deployment, debris removal, distribution of relief supplies

Living Heritage Foundation Scholarship Program

We provide a scholarship for Leslie Jimenez a student in Western Guatemala. She is in grade 11. Her school year is from February to November and we provide tuition assistance plus funds for her to participate in the Lifting Up My Student program which provides online courses with private tutors to help with subjects at school. Your gifts make a difference in Leslie's life.

Leslie's scholarship is totally funded by your donations (no money comes from the church budget). Leslie's scholarship for 2025 is \$1490.00. A container remains on the table at the back of the sanctuary for your donation. Your help is really appreciated for the 2025 school year.

Heifer Highlights

Robina Akello is a 24 year old with a young son. She used to worry about the kind of future she could provide for him. In Northern Uganda, where they live, poverty is common and Robina wondered if she would be able to give her son the future he deserved. But thanks to Heifer International she no longer worries. Robina joined a Heifer self-help group where she was introduced to a farming cooperative.

Through the co-op, she received training in best farming practices, money management and, most importantly, Heifer helped her buy soybean seeds - a crop she could plant on her small farm and sell for a reliable income. Small seeds made a big difference. Robina's farm and family are now thriving. The co-op collects her crop directly and sells it for her.

Robina can now provide for herself and her son plus grow her farm. She has been able to purchase three goats, added a variety of vegetables and plans to buy oxen to plow her land. Thanks to those who support Heifer, Robina and others can create the bright future for themselves and their children that they all deserve.
