Waiting For Christmas

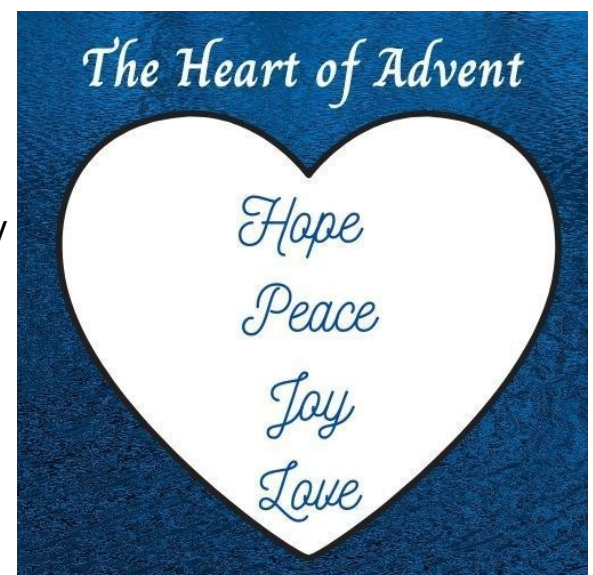

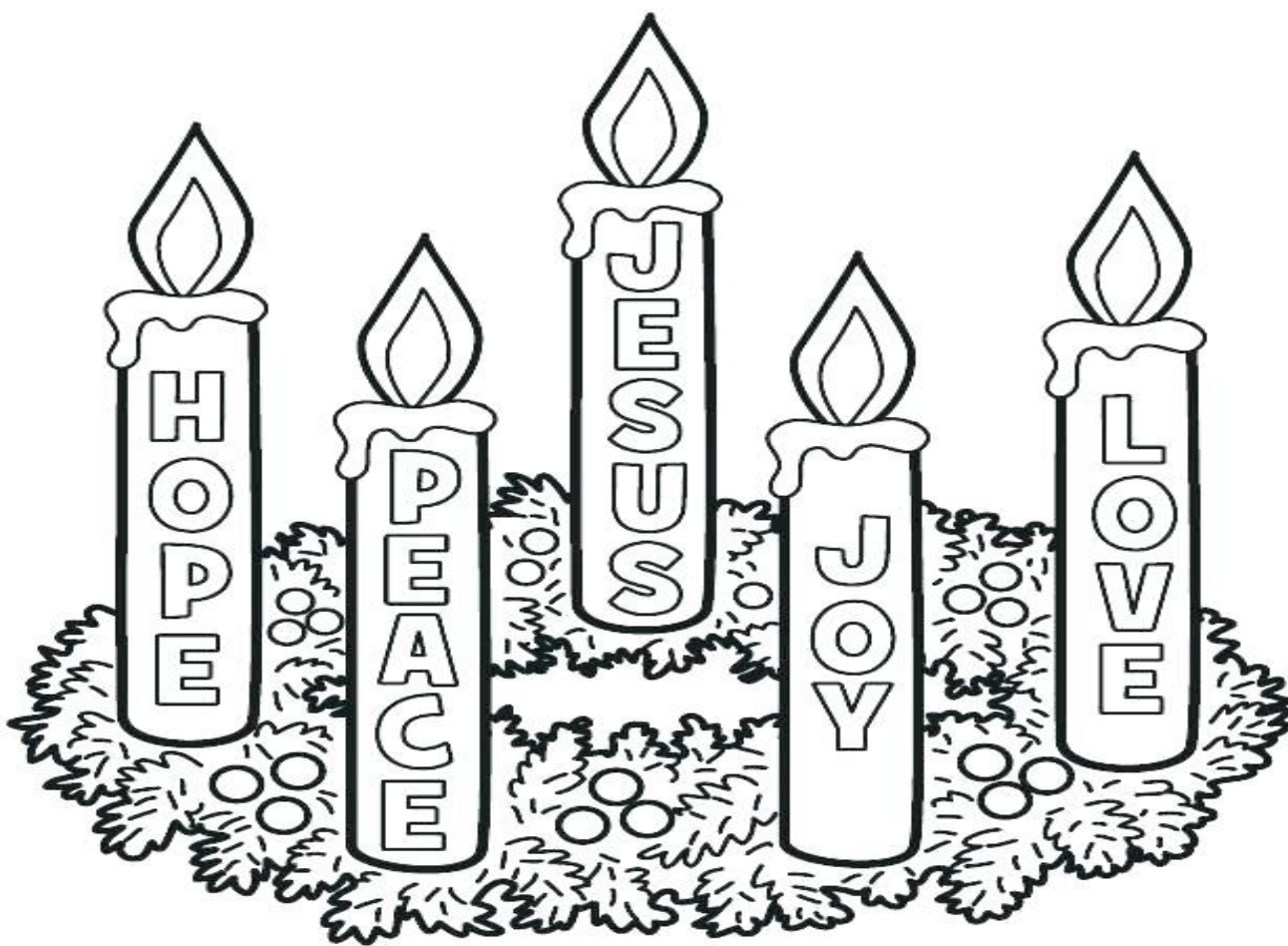
Advent

As we enter Advent, may we open our hearts to the light of Christ and share that light with others, embracing the hope and renewal this season brings.

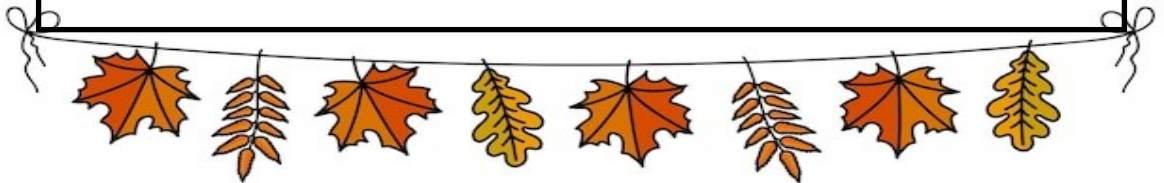
